But beyond the names and the notes, this season is about something deeper. It's about the unique experience of a Music in the Morning concert—an hour we hope leaves you not just moved, but renewed. Audiences rise to their feet in applause, yes, but more importantly, they walk out into the world feeling somehow different.

That is the power of live music, played by artists who understand that performance is about connection. And that is why, after more than 40 years, we continue to grow—not by getting bigger, but by staying close.

MARC-ANDRÉ HAMELIN, PIANO

TIMOTHY CHOOI, VIOLIN AMANDA CHAN, PIANO

A legend among pianists, Marc-André Hamelin's performances are nothing short of breathtaking. Renowned for his staggering technique and profound musical insight, he brings a rare blend of intellect and emotion to the piano. Whether interpreting the timeless masterpieces of Beethoven, unearthing forgotten gems, or sharing his own compositions, Marc-André's playing is a masterclass in artistry. His program includes Beethoven's C Major Sonata, Op. 2, No. 3, Haydn's Piano Sonata in D Major, and the monumental Rachmaninov Piano Sonata No. 2 in B-flat Minor. An MitM favorite, his return to our stage will remind us why he's considered one of the greatest and most thoughtful pianists of our time. Don't miss this opportunity to hear the pianist critics call the "thinking man's virtuoso" (Washington Post).

Violinist **Timothy Chooi** joins forces with pianist **Amanda Chan** for a concert of dazzling virtuosity and heartfelt lyricism. One of the most exciting international talents on the world stage today, Timothy captivates audiences with his golden tone, impeccable technique, and magnetic stage presence. Timothy has won multiple top prize honours including the Queen Elizabeth, Montreal Symphony, and Joseph Joachim International Violin Competitions. Paired with the brilliant and sensitive artistry of Amanda Chan, this duo promises an unforgettable musical journey. Their program is anchored by César Franck's soaring Violin Sonata in A Major and Maurice Ravel's fiery *Tzigane*. Expect passion, poetry, and breathtaking artistry.

A voice that can melt hearts and a presence that lights up the room—mezzo-soprano Julie Nesrallah returns to MitM for a festive program filled with warmth and charm. Back by popular demand, Julie's storytelling and flair brought our audiences to their feet in rapturous applause. Paired with the exquisite pianism of Kinza Tyrrell, this concert will bring a sparkle to the season with a mix of timeless classics, holiday favorites, and irreverent commentary that only Julie can deliver. Whether singing torch songs, beloved carols, or operatic gems, she connects with audiences in a way that feels both intimate and grand. Expect to leave with spirits lifted and melodies lingering long after the final note.

This reunion is not to be missed! The internationally acclaimed Afiara Quartet, known for its dynamic energy and fearless artistry, takes the stage alongside MitM's past-artistic director Barry Shiffman in a program that celebrates the thrill of chamber music—and new commissions. Hear the West Coast premiere of renowned composer Osvaldo Golijov's string quintet Tintype, co-commissioned by MitM. Afiara will also give the world premiere of an MitMcommissioned string quartet by Grammy Awardwinning composer Pascal Le Boeuf. In a program of premieres anchored by the powerful Brahms Sextet in G Major, these long-time friends explore the great masterpieces while bringing fresh perspectives to the repertoire. The Brahms Sextet will introduce our audience to rising star cellist, Canon Shibata.

JONATHAN CROW, VIOLIN

For three decades, the **Brentano Quartet** has been synonymous with precision, warmth, and expressive depth. Known for their eloquent interpretations and seamless ensemble playing, they bring a level of artistry that turns each performance into an intimate conversation. Our long-time subscribers will know why the critics call the Brentano a "masterclass in eloquence" (*The Guardian*). Their MitM return promises to be yet another unforgettable experience with Haydn's Op. 20, No. 4 and the monumental and breathtaking Beethoven Op. 59, No. 3. Whether you're a devoted quartet lover or new to the genre, this is an opportunity to hear one of the world's finest string quartets up close.

Bach's concerti are timeless, and few violinists bring them to life with as much brilliance as soloist, chamber musician, and concertmaster Jonathan Crow. Jonathan possesses a unique gift to lead exquisite interpretations of Bach's intricate works with nimbleness and the sense of immediacy. Jonathan will be by a handpicked ensemble of superb collaborators, including Vancouver Symphony's principal flutist, Christie Reside, Amanda Chan on harpsichord, and up-and-coming violin soloist, **Anna Stube**. This concert will explore Bach's iconic concerti: The E-Major Violin Concerto, the Double Violin Concerto, and the Brandenburg Concerto Grosso No. 4. Expect a grand and refined party of great Canadian musicians filling our stages this concert week.

Few musicians embody the spirit of Canadian music like Oscar Peterson, and few trumpeters bring his legacy to life like **Jens Lindemann**. A virtuoso performer and former member of the legendary Canadian Brass, Lindemann leads an all-star ensemble in this exhilarating tribute marking the 100th anniversary of Peterson's birth. The *Canadiana Suite*, Peterson's iconic musical portrait of Canada, will be the heart of the program, alongside tributes to jazz trumpet legends including Doc Severinsen, Chuck Mangione, Al Hirt, Herb Alpert, and Louis Armstrong. Expect a performance filled with brilliance, soul, and the kind of swing that leaves audiences buzzing.

As MitM's June Goldsmith Quartet-in-Residence, the **Viano Quartet** is carving out a place among the world's finest young ensembles. Winner of the prestigious 2025 Avery Fisher Career Grant, the Viano Quartet is the Bowers resident string quartet of the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and first-prize winners of the Banff International String Quartet Competition. Praised for their fearless interpretations, they bring fresh energy and breathtaking artistry to everything they play. This performance will showcase their signature blend of passion, precision, and camaraderie—qualities that have made them an audience favorite. They will present Mendelssohn's *Cappricio*, George Walker's *Lyric for Strings*, and Beethoven's String Quartet Op. 59, No. 1.

What happens when one of the world's top clarinetists joins forces with one of the most exciting young quartets? James Campbell, an icon of Canadian classical music, brings his warmth, lyricism, and impeccable technique to Mozart's Clarinet Quintet—a masterpiece of luminous and expressive chamber music. Known to long-time MitM subscribers, Jim unearths treasures from his lifetime journey of collaborating with a long list of string quartets, including the Amadeus, Guarneri, Vermeer, St. Lawrence, Afiara, and Cecilia String Quartets. With the Viano Quartet providing their signature artistry and deep musicality, this concert will celebrate the rich collaboration over a fifty-year age gap. Viano offers Florence Price's Five Folksongs in Counterpoint to open each concert: An inspiring way to close the season.
